Growing up in rural North Wales, I've witnessed first-hand the toll that industrialised farming is taking on our environment and on animals, and I've faced my own struggles with knowing how to respond to that.

Theatre has always been a forum to explore ethical and societal issues. I wanted Mad Cow to be an optimistic, positive force, encouraging people to think and talk more about sustainability and the ethics of the meat industry - important issues that we can no longer ignore.

But fundamentally, Mad Cow is a human and relatable story. It's about family, about growing up 'different', about greed and standing up for your beliefs. We've all felt like the odd one out, we've all felt helpless when the world doesn't seem to care about the things we care about. Mad Cow takes

those feelings and creates an uplifting, heart-full, delightfully mad story. It's been a joy to make and I hope it's a joy to watch.

I'm so grateful to the immensely talented actors and musicians who have joined me on this journey. They've taken my words and transformed them into something so much richer than I could have imagined. I'm also grateful to Alison and Terry who have welcomed us into The Garlinge. Their ethos for the theatre chimes with my own mission at Quaestio Productions and I can't imagine a better venue for our debut.

More than anything, I'm excited for Mad Cow to finally have an audience. So, thank you for coming. I hope it sparks a positive conversation.




LOIS ODELL




ROSANNE PRIEST

DID YOU KNOW..?

Every day 900,000 cows, 3.8 million pigs, 1.7 million sheep and 202 million chickens are slaughtered globally.

Every year around 95,000 male calves are shot soon after birth in the UK and discarded as a by-product of the milk industry.

Pigs have an average lifespan of 15 to 20 years but are routinely slaughtered at just 6 months old.

In the UK, 95% of chickens produced for meat are intensively reared in factory farms.

Reforesting farmland currently used to graze animals in the UK would remove over 3,000 million tonnes of CO2 from the atmosphere, offsetting nine years of emissions.

Vegan diets are typically high in fibre and low in saturated fats, and eating less meat can help reduce your risk of heart disease, bowel cancer and diabetes.
